Your rights and support – impairment benefit and dispute resolution applications

Summary

In this episode, we explore the third major “no fault” entitlement available under an accepted TAC claim: the Impairment Benefit Lump Sum. We explain what an impairment claim involves, when it can be made, and the assessment process.

We also outline the Dispute Resolution pathways available if you disagree with a TAC decision, including when and how to lodge a dispute, the current TAC trial pathways, and how [specialised TAC lawyers](#) can support you.
